

PROGRAMS AT HCCADA



Youth Prevention — Evidence-based prevention curriculum taught in schools Bexar County and the Texas Hill Country teaching social and emotional learning. Presentations in substance use prevention and community outreach activities are available to schools, churches, and community events as requested. Youth prevention services are **FREE**.



Prevention Resource Center (PRC) – Representing Region 8, the PRC services the 28 counties of South-Central Texas providing the most current data and statistics relevant to risk and protective factors associated with substance use. Also provides **FREE** presentations and education resources to South Texas.



Recovery Support Services – Recovery Coaches and Recovery Support Specialists provide peer-to-peer services and support to help individuals, with a substance use condition, initiate and maintain their recovery and wellness. The recovery team promotes all pathways to recovery and partners with community organizations across the region to enhance recovery-focused community efforts. Recovery support services are **FREE** and are available face-to-face, telephonically, and online via **www.recoverytexas.org**.

Education & Training – Fee for service court mandated classes to youth and adults: Driving While Intoxicated (DWI), Alcohol Awareness Course (MIP/Minor in Possession), Alcohol and Drug Awareness Education (ADAEP), Marijuana Awareness Education, and First Friday Workshops (continuing education hours). SACADA is a certified provider of DWI Education and Alcohol Awareness Course by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.








WHAT IS RED RIBBON WEEK?







Nearly 9 in 10 U.S. youth who report current use of e-cigarettes use flavored e-cigarettes.





















Vaping increases young people's risk of smoking.







Nicotine is a stimulant, which means it causes your heartrate and blood pressure to increase.

NO SALES OF CIGARETTES, E-CIGARETTES, OR TOBACCO PRODUCTS IN TEXAS.

It is illegal for anyone younger than 21 to buy cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco products, and it is illegal to sell or provide cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco products to anyone under 21. Purchasing or attempting to purchase cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco products by a person under 21 years of age is prohibited by law. Sale or provision of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco products to a person under 21 years of age is prohibited by law. Upon conviction, a Class C misdemeanor, including a fine of up to \$500, may be imposed. Violations may be reported to the Texas Comptroller's Office by calling 800-345-8647.

- The prohibitions on the purchase or attempt to purchase described above do not apply to a person who is
 in the United States Military Forces or State Military Forces.
- The prohibitions on the purchase or attempt to purchase described above do not apply to a person who was born on or before August 31, 2001.

Tobacco 21

- ➤ On September 1st of 2019 it became <u>illegal</u> for anyone under the age of 21 to purchase tobacco or e-cigarette products
- This law is an important step toward reducing youth smoking and preventing a lifetime of dependency and disease

House Bill 114

Effective September 1, 2023, students caught vaping or with ecigarettes will be removed from class and placed in a Disciplinary Alternative Education Program, or DAEP






